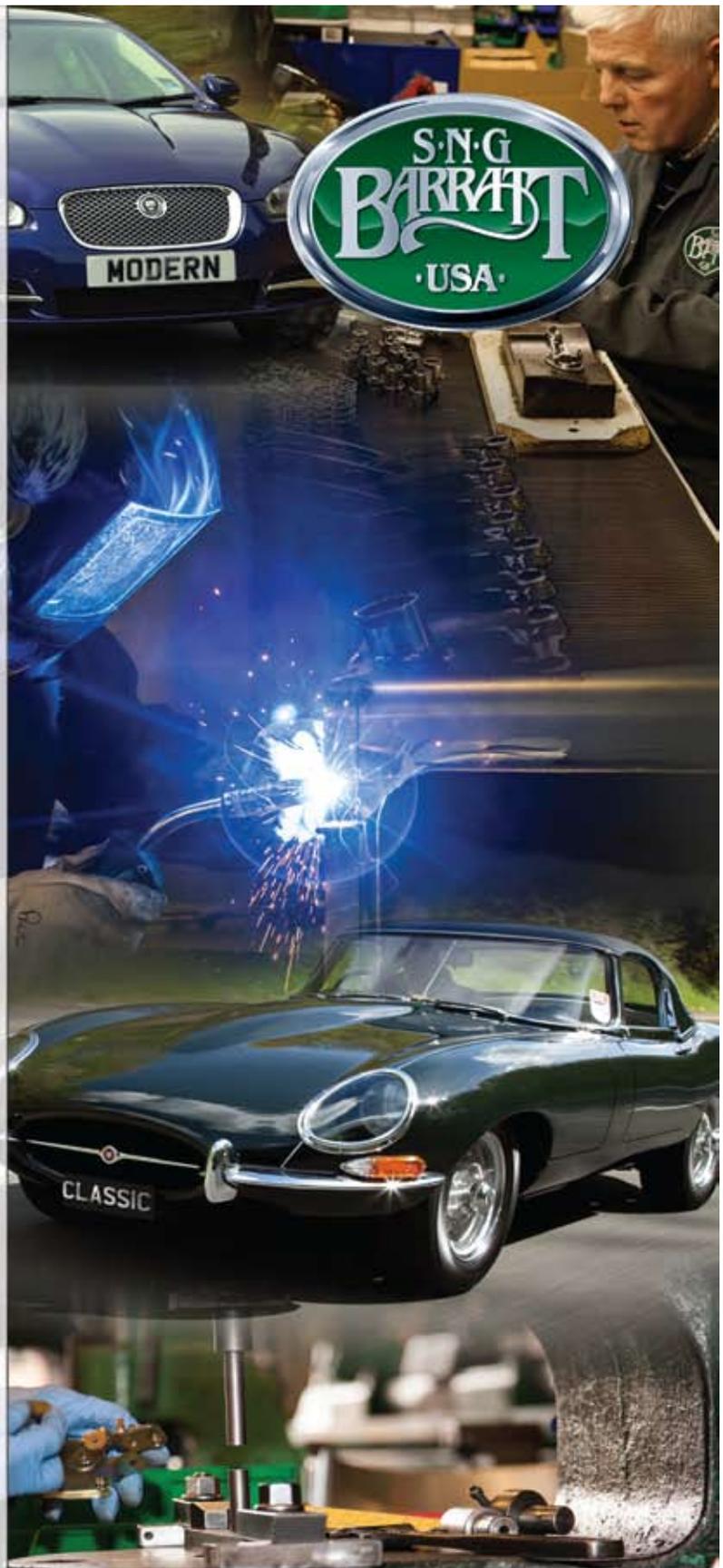



The Concours field layout for the cars is already finished, as we are anticipating a record turnout, and the judging teams are starting to be organized.



Slalom's First Bloom!

It began a day early, for me at least. I drove up to our storage facility in North Andover and waited for Paul Bicknell, JANE Slalom's better half, to join me for the semi-annual ritual loading of the rental truck. We piled in the cones and clocks, chalk and chairs, the stuff that makes an event take shape on the hot tarmac of In-Control Driver Training, a big, flat, open space that twice a year becomes the Isle of Man and Private Idaho for the Jaguar Association of New England. We lock up the truck on-site and check for the markers we periodically re-paint to facilitate setup. Since the one-hour trip becomes two and a half hours through the underbelly of Boston otherwise known as I93 on Friday afternoon, we skip the pub crawl and get out of Dodge. Thank God for air conditioning and automatic transmissions.

The Saturday morning drive is a breeze, with a cloudless sky and the sun already hotter than Lindsay Lohan in Daisy Dukes! When I get there, Bob Totten has his beautiful Triumph GT6 still on the trailer and Dave has a fantastic Formula Vee ready for its maiden voyage.

It's then that I get a phone call from Michele, of "Bob's Buns on the Run." Their old school food truck has broken down! Drat and Bother! Curses! My floppy, sloppy heart is in a state of cardiac arrest. Their delicious breakfast sandwiches, hamburgers, chilibogs, and BLT's will not be the food of the faithful. It seems like mass without communion, but we put on a brave face and forge forward.

Soon Paul shows up and we erect shade, set out cones, blah, blah, blah, and, like magic, we're ready. People and cars are filling the parking lot. Victor Cromie, with his beautiful wife, daughter, and son-in-law, show up with their toys, an XK140 OTS, a Porsche 356 SC, and a 1930 Austin Seven open-wheeled racer. Victor is a real live Dos Equis Guy with great style, a British accent, and unparalleled Joie de Vivre. Dennis Eklof brings his brutal Brunton Stalker, while Dean Cusano, "the fastest man in JCNA," brings his modified XJS that was a featured car on the floor of this year's AGM. Tony Lee, of SNG Barratt, came down from New Hampshire with his wife, who we recruited to wave the starter flag, and his blistering black XF Supercharged. His first go at it ever and still he turned the fastest street Jaguar time of the day at 44.414! COOL! Diane and Kevin Murphy came for the first time, too. Diane, as well as Gabrielle Cromie, Victor's plucky bride of more than fifty years, went through our driver's school to familiarize themselves with the course, a smart first step that takes any fear or mystery out of Slalom.

Registration and tech inspection went quickly, with Dean and Paul making sure there were no loose floor mats or coffee cups and explaining the rules of the road to oldtimers and newcomers alike. In all, we had 22 cars entered and 30 participants. John Feng brought the Westfield Eleven (Lotus 11 kit-car). John Larsen drove his XJ6C up from Maryland to prove he's not just fast, but also willing to drive ungodly distances to Slalom. We even had a funky, perfunctory Prius! Though not as big as last fall's JCSNE Slalom, I believe it was our biggest ever and a precursor to our Fast and Furious Fall Slalom slated for September 13 this year.

There's lots more to tell, but my editor is clamoring for copy and I must comply! I promise to tell you "the rest of the story" next month, with some information about the July 13 JCSNE Slalom in New Britain, Connecticut, thrown in for good measure.

Rallye for a Cure

On early Saturday morning, June 21, I drove to Hartford, Connecticut, from our home in Framingham, Massachusetts, together with my brilliant navigator (and wife), Diane. The cause? The second annual “Rallye for a Cure” sports car rally, which raises money for the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation, was being run, mostly over scenic back roads, from Hartford to Thompson, Connecticut, ending at the Thompson Speedway facility with its newly completed road course.

Mileage was checked for total distance traveled, and too many miles cost you points, as did incorrect answers on the question sheets. The starting point was at Hartford Jaguar, where we were greeted by our terrific rallye masters, Bill and Linda Wright, together with a fresh continental breakfast and new F-Types filling the showroom and warming us up in more ways than one. The dealer was one of the event sponsors and was a very generous host. All told, 40+ cars showed up with their owners to enter the rallye and help the cause. Among them were a couple of E-Types and an “old” S-Type, as well as the usual TR-6’s, Healey 3000’s, a Sprite, Morgans, MGA’s (several), MGB’s (including a GT), and even a Mustang and a Mercedes SLK.

There were several classes that you could register under, depending on your car and equipment level. We chose to enter under “Classic,” as I was driving my ‘74 Alfa Spider for this event; I needed that “wind in the hair” feeling, which my lovely S-Type does not give. I always thought the S would have made a great convertible, oh well....

We also registered in the “Seat of the Pants” class, where no instruments whatsoever could be used, not even a compass, and certainly not a smart phone or GPS. Gotta say one thing, doing this kind of rallye that way keeps your eyes on the lookout and on the road, where they should be. The Connecticut countryside, once we exited the Hartford suburbs, was very beautiful on the first day of summer, and we enjoyed it very much. The route even took us over a narrow, but smooth, paved road built on top of a large dam! No, we weren’t off course!

At the finish, we had our mileage checked and turned in our rallye sheets, then lined up for (drum roll, please) three laps of the new Thompson circuit! What a beautiful little road course. No passing, but fast enough that, given how much trouble the apexes were for me, even with the Spider, I can only imagine how challenging it must be for a racer hitting them at twice the speed. It seemed there were a lot of hairpins, which is probably not true, and there was even one long curve that was very off-camber. A great course, and I can’t wait to hear from the JANE racers who were at the vintage races held the last weekend in June on their impressions.

After the laps, we walked over to the very nice restaurant at the track, which also serves the golfers from Thompson’s abutting golf course, where we partook of a “cookout” style buffet, which was part of the package. There were also bar facilities, which was fortunate, the day having gotten almost hot.

After the meal, winners were announced and certificates handed out. Lo and behold, we took First in the Seat of the Pants class and Second in Classic. Shocking! But it would have been a lot of not-to-be-missed fun regardless of how we did, and we’re hoping we can get back there for the 3rd annual rallye next June. Maybe we’ll see you there?


